Winter CEO & Board Leader Gathering

Our winter gathering at Monmouth University welcomed 350 nonprofit CEOs and Board Leaders for a morning centered on connection, collaboration, and renewed inspiration. The event featured a powerful keynote from Charles Antelme of the McChrystal Group, whose talk, "Into the Sun", offered candid insights on leadership, teamwork, and perseverance - shaped by his distinguished military service and advisory work with global organizations.



Through vivid stories from his time in the British Army and Special Forces, Charles outlined nine core leadership principles designed to help leaders navigate uncertainty, strengthen their teams, and stay mission-focused.



Acknowledging the challenges nonprofits have faced this year, Charles emphasized the importance of resilience. "Like the weather in New Jersey - if you don't like it, wait a minute - it's bound to change," he shared. "Tenacity, stoicism, and most importantly, the strength gained from strong teams will sustain you."

Looking Forward: What’s Coming Next


